SENIOR EXIT INTERVIEW HANDBOOK

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Introduction to the Senior Exit Interview

The Senior Exit Interview is a graduation requirement established by the South Fayette Township School District with the following purpose:

- 1. To provide all seniors with a culminating real-world learning experience, with particular emphasis on personal reflection and career acquisition.
- 2. To gain valuable feedback from students about their educational experience.
- 3. To assess a student's ability to apply, analyze, synthesize, evaluate, and communicate information related to their career interests, career pathway, and postsecondary planning with significant knowledge and understanding.

Context

The Senior Exit Interview is the capstone experience to career education and exploration that has taken place in grades 9 through 12. Students begin preparation for the interview in 9th grade with the creation of their career portfolio. Activities, lessons, and experiences meeting the Career Education and Work Standards related to career exploration, career acquisition and retention, and entrepreneurship continue through 11th grade. Please see the table below outlining the Career Portfolio and Senior Exit Interview:

No other notes are permitted. 	
Grading	Students will be graded on individual assignments by the corresponding teacher as they are completed for the purpose of the career portfolio.	A rubric will be provided to all seniors in advance of the interview. This rubric will be used to determine a final grade. The final grade will be reflected on the transcript as PASS/FAIL and students will be awarded .25 credit for completion.	

Time Frame

The Senior Exit Interview will take place in the spring of the senior year. Please review the school calendar for the specific date. The school calendar can be found on the South Fayette High School website.

Logistics

On the Senior Exit Interview Day, each student will be assigned a specific interview time. One student will meet with a panel of South Fayette teachers. Students will present an introduction about themselves. Following the introduction, they will be asked a series of questions, to which they must provide thoughtful and relevant responses. The length of the interview will vary depending on the depth of responses. Most interviews take between 15-30 minutes.

"What happens if I do not complete the exit interview?"

If the student does not meet the exit interview requirement, he or she will have his/her diploma withheld until this requirement is met.

Grading/Scoring

Maximum number of points: 100 Introduction: 10 Professionalism: 10 Interview questions: 80 Score 65% and above = PASS Score 64% and below = FAIL

Senior Exit Interview will be listed on the transcript as P or F and .25 credit earned.

The following scenarios will result in an automatic failure:

- An introduction is not provided
- Student arrives more than 10 minutes late
- Student is dressed unprofessionally, for example:
 - Sweatpants, hoodie, ripped jeans, sneakers

<u>Rubric</u>

INTRODUCTION

Possible total points: 10

- Must include:
 - Student's name
 - Student's future plans (i.e., college and college major, employment, apprenticeship, gap year, etc.)
 - Any involvement in activities outside of the classroom (part-time job, extracurricular activities, hobbies, personal interests, athletics, etc.)
- Must bring and discuss one project or assignment they feel helped them prepare for their future/career pathway (this can be from a class OR from their career portfolio)
 - This can include pictures, a description, final product, etc.
 - Student should be able to explain:
 - The assignment
 - How the assignment helped them prepare for their future/career pathway
- The use of technology is required for the introduction

PROFESSIONALISM

Total possible points: 10

- Includes:
 - Punctuality
 - Professional appearance and dress
 - Appropriate language, grammar, and volume
 - Appropriate eye contact
- **9-10:** Student met all four professionalism components.
- **7-8:** Student met three professionalism components.
- **5-6:** Student met two of the professionalism components.
- **1-4**: Student met one of the professionalism components.
- **0**: Student did not meet any of the professionalism components.

- Obstacles you have overcome throughout high school
- Influential people in your life
- Career research and exploration
- Work experience
- Your overall experience at South Fayette
